**ORDER DECLARING FINANCIAL
DISCLOSURE FINE UNCOLLECTIBLE**

This matter came before the Commission on Ethics meeting in public session on Friday, January 27, 2017, in the matter of Brian Miller. Section 112.3145(7)(f), Florida Statutes, assesses an automatic fine of \$25 per day on each person who is required to file an annual Statement of Financial Interests (CE Form 1), but whose form is not timely filed, up to a maximum of \$1,500.

1. Brian Miller served as a member of the Boynton Beach Planning and Development Board and, as such, was required to file a 2014 CE Form 1, Statement of Financial Interests, no later than September 1, 2015.

2. Brian Miller's CE Form 1 was never received, resulting in an automatic fine of \$1,500.00.

3. Under Section 112.3145(7)(i), Florida Statutes, any fine that is not waived by a Final Order of the Commission, and remains unpaid more than 60 days after the Notice of Payment Due is transmitted, must be submitted to the Department of Financial Services as a claim, debt or other obligation owed to the state.

4. In December of 2016, internet research by staff of the Commission on Ethics confirmed that Brian Miller passed away on October 22, 2016.

5. On its own motion, the Commission determines that the \$1,500.00 fine assessed against Brian Miller is uncollectible and requests that the Department of Financial Services consider it to be exempt from collection.

Brian Howard Miller of Boynton Beach Florida and 50year resident of Somerville, NJ, passed away Saturday, October 22, 2016 at the age of 74, after a long battle with cancer. Brian is predeceased by his lovely parents Max and Rebecca Miller of Somerville, NJ.

Brian graduated from the Rutgers College of Pharmacy in 1963. Early in his career he owned the Branchburg Pharmacy and later went on to become the Director of Pharmacy at the Somerset Medical Center as well as President of the NJ Pharmaceutical Association.

As a life long volunteer who was committed to serving his community, Brian embraced Tzedakah (translated giving aid and charity) in all aspects of his life. He was a Somerville volunteer fire fighter, little league coach, implemented a poison prevention childproof campaign, educated and ran programs on high blood pressure, was instrumental in starting a \$2 prescription program for seniors, Chairman of Pride in Somerville (an annual community wide clean up), organized the funding and installation of the Veterans Monument which stands outside the Somerville Public Library, was a councilman and police commissioner in Somerville, NJ.

Upon moving to Florida in 1991, his volunteer efforts continued. Brian was the chairman of the Community Relations Board and member of the Planning Board for the town of Boynton Beach, president of his condominium association and the League of Village Royal on the Green, where he resided and he was an active volunteer at the Boynton Beach High School. Brian Miller "made a difference" and his "selflessness" will be missed by everyone he touched.

Brian is survived by his wife Carol Miller and children Susan Miller Chacantias, Alissa Burnham, Robin Miller Bartholomew and husband Tom Bartholomew, Robert Burnham and wife Cathy Burnham, Nancy Zayas and husband Alan Zayas and by 10 grandchildren, Ryan, Jordan, Megan, Tyler, Jessi, Alexis, Cody, Nicole, A.J. and Adam.

Funeral services will be held at 11am, Thursday 10/27/16 at Bruce C. VanArsdale Funeral Home 111 North Gaston Avenue Somerville, New Jersey 08876. Interment to follow at Temple Sholom Cemetery in Bridgewater.
