The Honorable Dr. James Bush III is a former State Representative for District 109 in Miami, Florida. He is a long-standing advocate for people and communities and has provided leadership for and represented the hearts and mind of the residents in this community for almost four decades.

Dr. Bush III is a fourth-generation Baptist minister and grew up in a family of 13 children. Born in February of 1955, he was faced with a multiplicity of societal ills that could have prevented him from progressing in this society. As a young man, he disciplined and educated himself, and followed the golden rule: " ... do unto others as you would have others do unto you." He has strived to live his life as an example for others to follow and continues to work hard every day to ensure that he lives out his purpose to help create the best life possible for his family and the people God has assigned him to lead and guide.

Evangelist Bush is kept motivated by his purpose driven work with James Bush III Ministries, International. He earned a Doctorate in Divinity from Smith Chapel Bible College in 2004.

Bush was elected to the Florida House of Representatives in 1992 and completed four consecutive 2-year terms (8 years). He was re-elected in 2008 to the Florida House of Representatives, District 109 for a 2-year term, and was again re-elected in November 2018 concluding in November of 2022. In addition to his general Legislative duties, he also served on many legislative committees including the Economic Development Policy Committee, Elder & Family Services Policy Committee, Education Committees K - 12, Community College, Higher Education Universities, the Health and Family Services Policy Council, Criminal Justice Sub accomplishments in education.
