## PUBLIC VIDEO CONFERENCE MEETING MINUTES

# CONSIDERATION OF FINAL ACTION – JOINT STIPULATION

## Complaint Nos. 21-017, 21-031 (cons.), In re JOHN STEVENS

Present were Robert K. Robinson, Attorney for the Respondent; and Joseph C. Burns, Commission Advocate.

Mr. Burns summarized the proposed joint stipulation calling for a finding of violation of Section 112.313(6), Florida Statutes, and a recommended civil penalty of \$1,000. The proposed joint stipulation also called for the dismissal of a second allegation of a violation of Section 112.313(6), Florida Statutes.

Mr. Robinson was heard by the Commission.

Commissioner Lile, seconded by Commissioner Rodgers, moved to approve the proposed joint stipulation. By unanimous vote, the motion carried.

#### CONSIDERATION OF DISMISSAL OF CERTAIN ALLEGATIONS IN COMPLAINT

Complaint No. 17-107, In re SUSAN HAYNIE

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Present were Mark Herron, Attorney for the Respondent; Susan Haynie, Respondent; and Joseph C. Burns, Commission Advocate.

Commissioner Rodgers disclosed that he is acquainted with the Respondent.

Staff Attorney Amelia Naomi was heard by the Commission regarding new statutory requirements and summarized certain allegations in the complaint to be dismissed based on the rationale contained in the draft order previously provided to Commissioners.

Mr. Herron was heard by the Commission.

Chair Philipson moved to approve the staff's recommendation. By unanimous vote, the motion carried.

#### CONSIDERATION OF ADVOCATE'S MOTION TO DISMISS COMPLAINT

## Complaint No. 23-002, In re LORI CUNNINGHAM

Present was Melody A. Hadley, Commission Advocate.

Ms. Hadley presented her Motion to Dismiss.

Chair Philipson moved to grant the Advocate's Motion to Dismiss Complaint. By unanimous vote, the motion carried.

File 2823. POSTEMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS: FORMER STATE ATTORNEY OR HIS PRIVATE FIRM REPRESENTING CLIENTS IN LITIGATION INVOLVING THE STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

Present was Dave Aronberg, Requestor.

Commissioner Lile, Commissioner Rodgers, and Commissioner Stewart disclosed that they are acquainted with the Requestor.

Assistant General Counsel Gray Schafer explained the basis of the draft advisory opinion and the rationale behind its conclusion.

Commissioner Lile, seconded by Commissioner Stewart, moved to approve the draft opinion, with a footnote addition. By unanimous vote, the motion carried.
